2.40(b)(3) Direct

Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

A gouldian finch was observed to be on the perch holding one leg up and hesitant to walk. A facility representative handled it for a closer look and its left leg was turned inward with a swollen/scabbed area over the ankle region. Facility representatives and the VMO that saw it closer agreed that it appeared to be a broken leg.

The scab appeared to be more than 24 hours old and indicates the injury occurred before the daily observation that was performed the morning of the inspection. This condition had not been identified prior to inspection and the animal had not been under treatment. Leg injuries such as these can be painful and must be promptly recognized so that animals can receive treatment. Ensure that a routine of adequate daily observations is in place so that health problems and injuries are recognized and veterinary treatment can be initiated.

***Ensure to maintain correct from December 12, 2025.

Primary enclosures.

The rabbits' group housing do not meet the minimum space requirement for 14 in height. Additionally, three group enclosures (26x45 in) with total floor space of 8.125 square feet housed 7 to 9 rabbits each. The maximum number of rabbits that could be housed in this sized enclosure to meet the minimum space requirements is 5 rabbits. Inadequate floor space can cause health problems and discomfort. Ensure the rabbits' housing meets the minimum space requirements per this subpart.

3.153(b)

Primary enclosures.

Approximately 5 primary enclosures housing about 40-50 budgerigars each were lacking enough space for each bird make normal postural and social adjustments. Each cage had 2-3 perches with tightly arranged rows of birds and several (about 10-20) birds resting on the floor of the enclosure. The remaining space on the perch would not have been able to comfortably contain all the animals.

Inspection Report

The normal behavior of a budgerigar is to rest on a perch, unless eating or drinking. Observing several animals resting on the floor while the perches are nearly full is abnormal behavior for the animals and indicates inadequate space, which can lead to psychological and physical health issues for the animals.

Correct by ensuring each bird can make normal postural and social adjustments including perching comfortably.
